Mayo Clinic contributed more than \$750K in community grants and sponsorships in 2nd quarter of 2023



Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota provided more than \$750,000 in community grants and sponsorships during its 2023 Quarter 2 grant cycle. The contributions to area nonprofits will help address mental health, health disparities, healthcare access, education, youth enrichment, human services, diversity and inclusion, arts and culture and community vibrancy in Olmsted County. Through its community investments Mayo Clinic strives to address identified community health needs; close health disparity gaps; advance equity,

diversity, and inclusion; and increase social and economic vibrancy in our community.

Highlights include grants to:

- Apple Tree Dental to serve dental care needs for underinsured and uninsured patients.
- Bolder Options to support youth mentoring programs.
- Channel One Regional Food Bank to expand food support to those in need.
- Children's Museum of Rochester to support youth enrichment programs.
- EarthFest to support sustainability education efforts.
- Greater Rochester Area Dakota Supporters to celebrate student academic achievement.
- NAMI Southeast Minnesota to support accessible mental health services.
- Pamoja Women to strengthen health initiatives among immigrant women and girls.

- Project Get Outdoors to expand nature enrichment opportunities for area youth.
- Quarry Hill Nature Center to strengthen nature education and enrichment programs for area youth, adults and families.
- Rochester Active Sports Club to support nature trail maintenance for recreational access for all.
- Rochester Area Economic Development Inc., to support area economic vibrancy.
- Rochester Civic Theatre to help sustain arts and cultural experiences for residents and visitors.
- Rochester Community Education Regional STEM Science Fair to enrich student academic experiences.
- Rochester Downtown Farmers Market to help sustain local food access and production.

Apply for a Mayo Clinic Social Innovation Grant



There is still time to apply for the Mayo Clinic Social Innovation Grant. The application period closes on July 31, 2023.

This grant, sponsored by Mayo Clinic's Department of Medicine, seeks digital innovation projects that improve health, enhance healthcare delivery and improve health equity in the greater Rochester area. Successful proposals will address mental health, substance use and access to care, the three most critical needs identified in the

2022 Community Health Needs Assessment.

"The Social Innovation Grant request for proposals is a new approach to addressing health equity. Our goal with this grant is to build something sustainable and potentially scalable throughout our community," says <u>Vijay Shah, M.D.</u>, chair of the Department of Medicine in Rochester. "We want to connect our commitment to caring for our community with our business development expertise through this opportunity."

Applications are due July 31 and winning proposals will receive:

- Funding to support the development of a 12-month proof of concept. Award funds will be allocated based on the needs of each winning proposal.
- Personalized coaching and consulting sessions with internal business development experts.
- Evaluation for possible business collaborations with Mayo Clinic and third-party partners.

Work will begin in the fall.

Small businesses (fewer than 500 employees) and nonprofit organizations seeking project support are encouraged to apply. Solutions should share implementation details, address barriers to success, demonstrate outcomes and outline the potential for collaboration with Mayo Clinic and third-party partners. Ideal applicants will also have strategies to build a scalable, sustainable model and feature effective, affordable and culturally acceptable technology.

The fantastic lineup of <u>speakers</u> includes a keynote by Eric Hargan, founder and CEO of The Hargan Group and former acting secretary and deputy secretary of the federal Department of Health and Human Services. There is a reduced registration fee of \$50 for government, non-profit, and

education staff and faculty. Abstracts do not need to be rigorous research. Descriptions of programs designed to improve community health and/or support healthcare workforce are welcome. Registration is free for those with accepted abstracts.

Host a free table at the Community Service Expo: This is a showcase to highlight the amazing work our community partners do to support community health and wellness. There is no fee for organizations to have a table at the expo and one member of the organization also receives complimentary registration. We encourage participating organizations to invite other members of their staff to attend the symposium at the reduced rate of \$50.

Mayo Clinic celebrates Juneteenth

Mayo Clinic buildings across the country were lighted red, yellow, and green on June 19 in celebration of Juneteenth. Juneteenth is an annual commemoration of the end of slavery in the United States after the Civil War, and has been celebrated by African Americans since the late 1800s. President Joe Biden signed legislation in 2021 that made Juneteenth a federal holiday. There has been a noticeable increase in Juneteenth celebrations across the United States over the past few years.

Juneteenth marks the day freedom from slavery finally came — on June 19, 1865 — when some 2,000 Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas. The army announced that the more

than 250,000 enslaved black people in the state were free by executive decree. This day came to be known as "Juneteenth" by the newly freed people in Texas and in time, people around the country. Mayo Clinic is proud to recognize this important event.
